I am Research Coordinator with Stirling Theological College (a university college of the University of Divinity), teaching courses on leadership, church revitalisation, mission, spiritual formation, world Christianity, church health, pastoral skills and methods, leading organisations through change and transition, and more. I focus most of my energy on inspiring and equipping the next generation of Christian leaders and researchers, through teaching undergraduate and postgraduate courses, supervising HDR research students, training HDR supervisors, and providing academic research leadership at the College, within the University of Divinity, and beyond. My passion is to develop and promote excellent research cultures among faculty and students, in partnership with colleges and universities, faculty and staff, industry partners, agencies, consortiums, churches, and research institutions.

As Research Coordinator I seek to promote and develop a continually improving research culture among faculty and students. This includes the direct supervision of Higher Degree by Research (HDR) students; post-doctoral support of HDR students into places of ongoing research contribution; guidance and encouragement of faculty research (both peer reviewed and otherwise); recruitment and guidance of a preferred research culture; and developing other avenues of original research (both individually and as a team). As Research Coordinator I oversee and guide this research culture in partnership with industry partners, the College Board, Faculty, and University of Divinity.

Responsibilities included:

1. As Vice-Principal, and then Provost, I was the Team Leader of the 14 Department and Faculty Heads.
2. During my term as Postgraduate Coordinator, I directed the postgraduate research and coursework programs of the College (I later shared this role with Dr Sloane).
3. Supervising PhD, DMin, and Masters research students, and their theses.
4. Guiding faculty on ways they can improve and increase their research quality and outputs, through significant monographs and academic peer-reviewed publications.
5. Teaching and coordinating Research Methods units.
6. Serving as the Morling College representative on the Australian College of Theology (ACT) Research and Research Studies Committee.
7. Working with Research Coordinators from other ACT Colleges, and with the ACT Director of Research, to improve and increase the ACT research standards and outputs.
8. Training and supporting HDR research supervisors.

9. Negotiating research projects, curriculum, and course revisions (as the Vice-Principal for academic affairs), with the Australian College of Theology, the University of Divinity, TEQSA, and ASQA.
10. Represented Morling College at the ACT annual general meetings and the annual Consortium Conferences in the role as Provost of the College.
11. Offering academic leadership within a wide range of administrative systems both in the Higher Education sector (especially TEQSA and the AQF), as well as the Vocational Education and Training (VET) sector.
12. Building and maintaining effective academic leadership, research initiatives, and professional relationships, across the ACT consortium.
13. Developing independent research projects through the research publications I have produced since completing my PhD on ecclesiology.
14. Promoting my research (and the research of the College) internationally, while seeking to be a scholar who utilizes (and who enables other scholars to utilize) new technologies and techniques to successfully disseminate our research findings.
15. Shaping and casting vision and strategy for the College and its research, so that we reproduce a generation of excellent and leading researchers who are competent, Christ-like, innovative, passionate, open, and collaborative.
16. Directing the Morling Centre for Leadership (which ran conferences, seminars, and courses on Christian leadership and healthy ministry, between 2007 and 2013).
17. Teaching undergraduate and postgraduate courses on developing leaders, leading change and renewal, comparative ecclesiology, approaches to leadership and spiritual formation, trends in World Christianity, and ways to make and mobilise leaders and disciples.
18. Aside from my commitment to the ACT and UD consortiums, I also serve on a wide range of Committees with the Australian Baptist movement of churches (during the period 2007 to 2018) with the aim of contributing to church leadership, church development, and pastoral health, including the Leadership Development Taskforce, the Committee for the Ministry, the Pastoral Advisory Taskforce, and more.
